
The Staff of EW.net picked out some books they enjoyed reading, and thought you would too!




The Notebook by

not as good as the novel!




The Time Travelers Wife by Audrey Neffenager.


The Virgin Suicides by Jeffrey Eugenides. The novel tells of the suicides of the Lisbon girls, five sisters living in Michigan during the 1970s. The suicides fascinate their community as their neighbours struggle to find an explanation for the acts.Depressing but brilliant, very different to the usual stories about teenage girls (the film starring Kathleen Turner and Kirsten Dunst is also great).




Idylls of the King by Alfred Lord Tennyson. This is the story of the legend of King Arthur as told by Tennyson. In a series of 12 narrative poems, or idylls, he tells us of the events in Arthur's life, from birth, the round table, Guinevere and Lancelot, the Holy Grail, and finally his passing. Written in verse, it's not as easy to read as regular prose, but I think the extra effort pays off in a deeper understanding of the story.


# 6 17 Books



The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn by Mark Twain. It really makes you step back and question what you've been taught is right and moral. It is eye-opening to see that an uneducated, outcasted boy without the influence of a corrupted and self-deluding society can be far more enlightened when it comes to matters of right and wrong. The story puts the issues and rhetoric of society's precious concept of "morality" into perspective and teaches readers to trust their own experiences and not some borrowed morality.




The Sun Also Rises, by Ernest Hemingway. Hemingway's famously plain declarative sentences linger in the mind like poetry. His cast of thirtysomething dissolute expatriates--Brett and her drunken fiancé, Mike Campbell, the unhappy Princeton Jewish boxer Robert Cohn, the sardonic novelist Bill Gorton--are as familiar as the "cool crowd" we all once knew. No wonder this quintessential lost-generation novel has inspired several generations of imitators, in style as well as lifestyle.



A Great and Terrible Beauty by Libba Bray. Powerful novel about a 16-year-old girl, Gemma, and her quest to find herself after moving from India to London in the late 1800's. Seems typical. It's not. This novel and its predecessor are definitely worth a read.



Go Ask Alice (anonymous). An account of drug abuse that has been controversial on several levels, is considered a classic of American young adult literature. First published by Prentice Hall in 1971, the book purports to be the actual diary of an anonymous teenage girl who died of a drug overdose in the late 1960s. The book is presented as a cautionary tale against drug use. Marketed to other teen girls, it caused a sensation when published and remains in print 36 years later (as of 2007)




1984 by George Orwell. Published in 1949, the book tells the story of Winston Smith and his degradation by the totalitarian state in which he lives. The world described in 1984 parallels the Stalinist Soviet Union and Adolf Hitler's Nazi Germany... but the thing is, you can always draw parallels between the this world and our world, especially with everything the new technologies enable us to do. Remember: "Big brother is watching you."



Where the Red Fern Grows by Wilson Rawls is more of a kids book, but you should still read it. It takes place in the Ozark Mountains. It's about a boy named Billy Coleman, who wants to buy two coonhounds. He can't afford them at first, so he saves up money over two years. Finally, his dream comes true...he buys the dogs. He names them Little Ann and Old Dan. They have many fun (and rough...) times together, and it's just a cute story...although the ending's a bit sad.




Lolita by Vladimir Nabokov.



But I think that what is the most interesting about this book is that, at the time it described something that was perceived as shocking, whereas nowadays it's become common to see very sexualised young girls (just turn on the TV!) which is, in my opinion, quite a worrying trend. Reading "Lolita" might help people realise how dangerous this may be.



The Book Thief by Markus
Zusak. This story is told through
the view of Death, who gives a
personalized account of a young
girl's life from the time she was
given up by her mother to the
time when World War II disturbs
her previously unaffected area of
Germany. In my opinion, it can
touch even the coldest person's
heart. I think you'll love it. It's
quite a hefty read though.




"Catcher in the Rye" by JD Salinger. A classic, about teenage angst. The novel covers a few important days in the life of the protagonist Holden Caulfield, a highly-critical and depressed sixteen-year-old who decides one night to run away from boarding school. You won't understand the character's feelings as well when you are 30, so maybe you should read the novel while you're still a teenager...



The Alchemist by Paulo Coelho (a Brazilian writer). An alchemist recounts a fable that he read along the way: Santiago, the protagonist, grew up with poor parents who struggled their whole lives to send him to seminary. But Santiago has a strong desire to travel the world... That book has a lot of dark things but it's quite an experience to read it!



Y De Repente, Un Angel (And Suddenly, An Angel) by Jaime Bayly. If you find this title in English, you'll enjoy this Peruvian story about friendship of a lazy writer who hires a 50-year-old illiterate woman as his maid, and finds himself intrigued with her story. The story is sweet, and quirky - the perfect plot for a nice quirky little independent film... if they ever make one.



Watership Down by Richard
Adams. Impending disaster cause a small group of adventurers to flee their homeland in search of a new place to live. Along the way they face many dangers. Not so unusual a theme, except in this story the characters are rabbits. While the author claims it is just a childrens story, the complex rabbit mythology and themes of religion and politics will give the adult reader something to think about.



### 17 songs you should listen to before turning 18

"The ONE song you should listen is **Tú Y Yo (You and I) by Gianmarco** from the album Resucitar. Picking this song was such a hard task to do, because I love all sorts of music. 




### City of God


### **American Beauty**



- 1. Samantha in "Garden State", played by Natalie Portman. The main reason is because Samantha's got the best lines in the film! She's got the "100% Original Moment", the tap dancing sequence and all the quirky humor mixed with that bit of drama.
- 2. Tracy in "Thirteen". I would love to see Emma playing her because Tracy is like the quiet girl (well not THAT quiet but...) that turns into a mess, that film blew me away! I think to see Emma in it would prove even more what a great actress she is! And it's not only that it's a very different role from Hermione! She would be PERFECT!




- 8. Elizabeth in "Just like Heaven". Elizabeth Masterson is a dedicated, workaholic doctor. One night, she gets into a tragic car crash. Now in a coma, she doesn't know she's dead and thinks nothing has happened until she meets David, a lonely architect who has just rented her old apartment... But Elizabeth is not willing to give up her place to David and starts haunting him. Elizabeth really is a touching character and I think Emma would play this high-energetic, funny yet serious woman really well.
- 9. Since I heard that Emma is good at singing and dancing, some kind of musical would be perfect (something like "Chicago").
- 10. Mia in "The Princess Diaries". Mia is really clumsy and very insecure about basically everything. But when she's told that she has to rule a country, her whole life changes and Mia stays very strong as she gets 'princess lessons' from her grandma, aka the Queen. The movie is so funny yet you see this girl trying to find herself and find out what she really wants. Emma would be perfect for such a role! Lots of actresses make appearances in music videos (Kirsten Dunst, Scarlett Johansson, Nicole Kidman and Julia Roberts did it, to name a few) and it's usually very well-done and original. Wouldn't it be cool if Emma was in the music video of one of these really good British bands that have been coming out lately?! And the good thing was that it would only take one or two days of her busy schedule...
